Hybrid International Conference “Mo.Na.: Monuments in Nature: A creative Co-existence.”

The European Centre for Byzantine and Post-Byzantine Monuments (EKBM) in the framework of Mo.Na Project organizes the international Conference “Mo.Na: Monuments in Nature: A Creative Co-existence”. The conference will take place on July 7th – 9th, 2021 in Athens, at the Amphitheatre, Directorate for Documentation and Protection of Cultural Goods (Agion Asomaton 33 street, Thiseio, Athens). The event will be hybrid, i.e. the speakers will participate in person, while the public will attend through an e-platform.

The European Centre for Byzantine and Post-Byzantine Monuments (EKBM) implements the project Mo.Na: Monuments in Nature: A Creative Co-existence (<https://www.monumentnature.com/>), funded by the INTERREG V - Balkan - Mediterranean 2014-2020.
